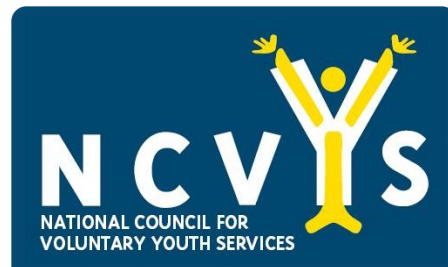


Eye of the Storm - Health and Wellbeing seminar
